

EXPEDITION INFORMATION

Your personal guide will do their absolute best to ensure your safety, comfort, and overall enjoyment while exploring with us. They are expert in their field, and love what they do. If you let us know in advance, your trips can be completely customized to suit your desired experience.

Your personal guide holds a minimum of Wilderness Guide Certification (PAWGI), and Advanced Wilderness and Remote First Aid Certification (Red Cross). It is likely that your guide has much more advanced and area specific training in their respective fields. Please enquire for more information should you wish to know.

The attached Equipment List is a guideline of what to bring with you. Once signed up, your personal guide will be in contact with you to discuss any further information you require on personal items/equipment*. For expeditions utilizing helicopter travel; please be mindful of load restrictions by the aircraft.

Wildlife Safety Procedures are strictly enforced by our guides for your protection. Please use unscented personal items as listed in your equipment list. Your guide will remove any dangerous personal items that may attract predators prior to departure for your safety.

A Medical Questionnaire form must be sent to us in advance of your expedition. This gives us ample time to prepare if applicable. A Release of Liability Waiver must also be signed by all party members however; this is signed in person along with your personal guide.

Minors are welcome on your expedition, in-fact, we strongly encourage and promote getting our youth into the outdoors! We only ask that they are accompanied by a parent/caregiver at all times, and can manage the expedition itself. Minors on the Donjek expedition are strongly discouraged due to its difficulty level.
